\*Students possessing competencies equivalent to INFS 1000 may choose OAD 1117 instead of INFS 1000. If so, INFS 1010 should be taken in the first semester, and OAD 1117 in the second semester. Students that do not possess INFS 1000 competencies should take INFS 1000 in the first semester, and INFS 1010 in the second semester. All computer accounting curriculum courses require a grade of C or higher for graduation. Students are required to complete a General Education exit exam that is administered by the institution and a major field exam that is administered in the capstone course. Students should become familiar with other graduation requirements listed in the catalog. It is the student's responsibility to insure that all requirements for graduation are met. Not all courses will be offered every semester, especially the second year courses. A recommended schedule is listed in the catalog. Please become familiar with this schedule and work with your accounting advisor when scheduling courses.
