



Belmont Partnership Admissions Process

1. Submit a transfer student application via BU4U on the Belmont Admissions website (<http://www.belmont.edu/admissions/apply/transfer/index.html>). **This program is only open for Fall enrollment.**
2. **Email your transfer counselor, Lauren Lauzon, to inform her of your interest in the Partnership.**
3. Send in transcripts from *every college & university* you have previously attended, including institutions you may have attended for dual enrollment and summer courses.
 - a. Minimum GPA requirements:
 - i. **2.5 Cumulative**
 - ii. **3.0 Prerequisite** (Microbiology, A&P I and II, Chemistry, General Psychology, Life Span Psychology, Statistics, and Nutrition)
4. Submit SAT or ACT scores.
 - a. Minimum score requirements:
 - i. 1100 Reading & Math combined score (March 2016-present)
 - ii. 1020 Reading & Math combined score (Prior to March 2016)
 - iii. 22 ACT composite score
 - b. Belmont offers a Residual ACT test each week for current applicants. The cost of the exam is \$50 and results are returned within one week. Scores can only be used for your application to Belmont.
5. An admissions decision will be returned to you by mail *within one to two weeks* of your completed application. If you are accepted, you will receive a Preliminary Transfer Report (PTR) that includes all of the courses that we expect to transfer into the Nursing program.
6. If accepted, you will confirm your spot in the program by submitting a \$250 enrollment deposit. **The due date for your enrollment deposit is June 1st.** Upon submission, you will receive information regarding your Belmont email account, orientation, housing, and health Forms.
7. Submit all final transcripts to Belmont reflecting your final grades and degree conferral. **Your enrollment in the program is contingent upon your completion of the course requirements and your Associate's degree.**
8. In May (prior to your entry term), you will receive an email with a list of requirements that you must complete in order to begin clinical coursework in your first semester.

PARTNERSHIP APPLICATION COMPLETION DEADLINE – February 1st

All transcripts & test scores must be submitted by this date.
