To successfully complete this course, the student is expected to:

Identify the safety, health and environmental issues associated with industry.

Demonstrate the ability to solve basic construction math questions regarding real numbers.

Identify basic hand tools, power tools, and materials handling tools used in the construction industry.

Demonstrate safe usage of basic hand tools, power tools, and materials handling tools used in the construction industry.

Demonstrate the ability to interpret basic construction blueprints.

Demonstrate basic communication skills used in the construction industry.

Identify the employability skills necessary for a career in the construction industry.

Course Competencies:

Students completing this course should have basic safety knowledge required to safely function as an operator in the construction industry.

Course Policies

The construction industry has a high potential for serious injury. Most industry injuries are the result of operators failing to follow basic safety practices. As students in this course, you should strive to learn as much about construction safety as possible. As a NSCC student working in an online environment, you should be courteous, thoughtful, detailed, and diligent throughout your coursework. Lack of initiative or motivation will surely impede your opportunity to complete this course successfully.

Student Responsibilities

My goal is for you to excel in this class and to develop the skills necessary to work safely in the construction industry. However, you have the major responsibility for doing well. Achievement of course objectives will require you to understand and demonstrate basic safety principles. Do not be a passive learner. Take the course material seriously. Ask questions. Once you enter the construction industry, your personal safety and the safety of those working around you will depend on how well you learn and utilize this information. Course quizzes will be open book and students may work collaboratively.

Tests will be conducted in class and will be proctored. Any test misconduct will result in 0% grade for the test and no opportunity for test makeup.

Individual Performance Verifications will be conducted by the instructor.

Instructor Presence/ Communication Plan

Virtual lectures will be presented each Monday. Students will have the opportunity to ask questions or seek clarification during and at the end of each lecture. Should students need individual assistance, they can schedule a private virtual meeting during posted office hours. The class schedule and instructor office hours may be found in the Course Information section of the Course Content. Participation/Attendance

This is a hybrid course. Students are expected to attend all lectures, tests and PV's. Attendance is 10% of the course grade. Each missed attendance will result in a proportional reduction in overall attendance grade. Students may miss a maximum of 5 classes and lectures. Missing 6 or more classes and lectures will a 0% attendance grade.

Time Management/Expectations

Students are required to attend a 2 hour virtual lecture each Monday and a 2 hours in class each Wednesday for testing and performance verification. In addition, students should plan 2-4 hours each to complete module quizzes and test preparation. Pro Tip: Treat this course like a part-time job and set aside several hours a week for study and test preparation. The more you put into this course the more you will get out of it.

Late Work

This course is a National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) certified course. In accordance with NCCER rules, all tests and Performance Verifications (PV's) must be conducted in class on campus. All tests and PV's should be completed on the scheduled date. Any missed tests or PV's must be complete on the following test/PV date. Quizzes must be completed by 5:00pm the day before a scheduled test. At 5:00pm the day before a scheduled test, the submission view of the associated quiz is available for the student to review in preparation for test. Quizzes will not be accepted after this time.

All lectures will be conducted virtual. Throughout and at the end of the lecture, time will be given for students to ask questions. Please hold questions until these times. Students are expected to attend virtual lectures with both audio and video.
