<sup>2</sup> **Social/Behavioral Sciences**: Choose from ECON 2010, 2020; GEOG 1010, 1020; POLS 1030, 2010; PSYC 1030, 2120, 2130; SOCI 1010, 1020, 2010

<sup>3</sup> **History**: Choose from HIST 1110-1120, HIST 2010-2020(recommended), HIST 2030. \*Students who lack the required one unit (one year) of American History from high school as an admission requirement must complete six (6) semester hours of American History or three (3) semester hours of Tennessee History to fulfill the history requirement in general education. Otherwise, students may choose from among the history courses approved at a particular institution to fulfill the six-semester hour requirement in history.

<sup>4</sup> **Mathematics**: Choose from MATH 1010, MATH 1130, MATH 1530, MATH 1630, MATH 1710, MATH 1720, MATH 1730, MATH 1830, MATH 1910. \*Because MATH 1710 or MATH 1130 is a prerequisite for MATH 1830, students must take one of these math classes to meet the prerequisite.

<sup>5</sup> **Natural Sciences**: Choose from BIOL 1010-1020(recommended), BIOL 1110-1120, BIOL 2010- 2020, BIOL 2115, BIOL 2211, CHEM 1110-1120, CHEM 1030, ASTR 1010, ASTR 1020, GEOL 1040, GEOL 1110, PHYS 2010-2020, PHYS 2110-2120, PSCI 1030
