

Note: Any 10 Music Technology courses fulfill the required 30 credit hours to earn the Technical Certificate.

The primary purpose of this certificate is to prepare students for employment following graduation from Nashville State. However, some students may wish to continue in a baccalaureate program either immediately or in the future. If you plan to transfer to a four-year program after leaving Nashville State, consult the department head for a specialized program of study. *Failure to do so could result in a loss of credits in the transfer process.*

All of the courses in the Music Technology certificate apply toward Nashville State Community College's A.A.S. degree in General Technology.
